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Introduction

The SABIS[®] Integrated Learning System[™] (ILS[™]) is a learning system that allows for the early detection and closure of learning gaps.

ILS[™] is designed to promote self-learning by providing you, as students, with ownership of your own individual learning development and to provide your teacher with immediate feedback on your performance.

Student Procedures

Setup

- 1. You need to have a charged tablet to log in to the **ILS[™]** lesson.
- 2. Make sure that you are connected to the local access point through Wi-Fi.
- 3. Prior to accessing the SABIS[®] Integrated Learning System[™], you will need to perform the following steps.
 - Download Google Chrome by visiting the Google Play Store¹.
 - Go to the ILS[™] web address and bookmark the page by clicking on the star ☆ in the URL box towards the right-hand side.
 - For ease of access, it is recommended to add a shortcut of this webpage on your tablet's home screen by clicking on the browser's menu : and select *Add to Home Screen*.

Getting Started

- 1. Log in to Teams and join the scheduled session.
- 2. When the webpage is launched, you will be redirected to the login screen.
- 3. Enter your first name, last name, and password², and tap on the *Login* button.

4. Once you have logged in, you will be redirected to an empty session (i.e. white screen) until the teacher starts the lesson.

Learn

- 1. Once all the students are logged in, the teacher starts by explaining the lesson and then sends the first content block (i.e. appropriate activities).
- 2. Within the **ILS**[™] lesson, time is allocated to each activity, which is shown towards the topright of your screen.
